ADJUSTABLE & REMOVABLE HOOD is supplied fixed to end of trough to prevent the Hay and Straw from blowing back in rough windy weather.

THE stacking of 280 tons of hav in one day by two elevators is a recent achievement which affords unmistakable evidence regarding the labour-saving value of this class of implement. The credit of that performance belongs to the two "Premier" elevators seen in the accompanying illustration, these being shown at work in one of the largest stackyards in the North of England.

In other quarters, doubtless, the "Premier" elevator has recently been effecting equally satisfactory work, for testimonials we have reproduced in THE REVIEW from time to time from home and foreign users of this implement fully warrant such a belief.

As the winner of 28 first prize gold and silver medals, the "Premier" enjoys a high reputation not only in the United Kingdom, but in Australia, Russia Sweden, Prussia, Austria, France, Morocco, Tunis, Algeria, and India, in all of which countries, we are assured, the machine is giving the utmost satisfaction. Strength of construction is noticeable throughout this elevator. The woodwork is of the highest class; and malleable iron is employed wherever there is any liability to breakage. The rake chains, which are of steel, are automatic and self-tightening, thus dispensing with the necessity of unscrewing and screwing up the liberators when folding or unfolding the machine. Another good feature is the provision of safety stop gear for preventing overwinding or turning in the wrong direction; whilst an additional recommendation is the fitting of an adjustable and removable hood to the end of the trough to prevent hay or straw from "blowing back" in rough, windy weather. The "Premier" elevator is made in different sizes and styles to meet the varied requirements of users, and can be fitted with either a stationary or lifting hopper. Messrs. E. & H. Roberts, Ltd., ot Deanshanger, Stony Stratford, are the makers of this popular machine, which, we may add, can be furnished with specially constructed gear for driving by an oil engine if desired.

### ROBERTS' "PREMIER'' ELEVATOR IN FRANCE AND TUNIS.

A<sup>T</sup> a recent meeting of the Farmers' Club, stack elevators were referred to by a practical agriculturist as "the greatest boon the farmer ever had," and the speaker declared that he did not know of any implement to which the farm labourer took so quickly, on account of the hard work it saved him. This encomium forms a well-deserved tribute to a highly valued labour-saving machine of a type which is annually finding increased favour at home and abroad. Amongst the most popular machines of this class is the " Premier," made by **Messrs. E. & H. Roberts, Ltd.**, of Deanshanger, near Stony Stratford, who have secured

for this elevator no less than twenty-eight first prize gold and silver medals. We have on many occasions had occular evidence of the favour with which this machine is regarded abroad, and we now have the opportunity of bringing before our readers illustrations of the machine in actual work in the South of France and in Tunis. Fig. 1 shows the "Premier" in operation in connection with a thresher on a farm near Alzonne, Aude, France, and in reference to its performances the owner writes :— "The Roberts' elevator has worked perfectly and renders excellent services. This machine deserves to be well known, as it can be extensively used (Continued on next page) for different work." Other French users speak much in the same strain. One says: "I am completely satisfied with the Roberts' elevator. It has proved very useful, and I find its working perfect." Another agriculturist remarks that "it works very well, and runs very light"; whilst a farmer at Lavalette intimates that he "can only speak of it with praise."

In the French colony of Tunis, too, the "Premier" is doing good duty. Fig 2 shows it at work behind a thresher in that country, from whence gratifying testimonials are also numerous. One well-pleased the machine is needed to work behind a threshing machine or in connection with a hay sweep, since the hopper can be raised or lowered to any desired extent with the greatest ease.

The "Premier" is the embodiment of good materials and workmanship. Malleable iron is used wherever practicable; the woodwork is of the best procurable quality; and the rake chains, which are automatic and self-tightening, are of steel, and so constructed that they cannot slip. Overwinding or turning in the wrong direction is prevented by the provision of a safety stop gear, accidents being thereby avoided; whilst
